We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the services we are to provide for Oak Forest Villas Condominium Association, Inc. for the year ended December 31, 2025.

Audit Scope and Objectives

We will audit the financial statements of Oak Forest Villas Condominium Association, Inc., which comprise the balance sheet as of December 31, 2025, and the related statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in fund balances and cash flows for the year then ended, and the disclosures (collectively, the "financial statements"). The financial statements will include supplementary information about future major repairs and replacements required by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). Although we will apply certain limited procedures with respect to the required supplementary information, we will not audit the information and will not express an opinion on it. Also, the following supplementary information accompanying the financial statements will not be subjected to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the financial statements and we will not provide an opinion or any assurance on that information for supplementary schedule of operating fund expenses and supplementary schedule of replacement fund activity.

The objectives of our audit are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion about whether your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements, including omissions, can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment of a reasonable user made based on the financial statements.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

We will conduct our audit in accordance with GAAS and will include tests of your accounting records and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such an opinion. As part of an audit in accordance with GAAS, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

We will evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management. We will also evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and determine whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the Association or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the Association.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, combined with the inherent limitations of internal control, and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is an unavoidable risk that some material misstatements may not be detected by us, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with GAAS. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, we will inform the appropriate level of management of any material errors, fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets that comes to our attention. We will also inform the appropriate level of management of any violations of laws or governmental regulations that come to our attention, unless clearly inconsequential. Our responsibility as auditors is limited to the period covered by our audit and does not extend to any later periods for which we are not engaged as auditors.

We will obtain an understanding of the Association and its environment, including internal control relevant to the audit, sufficient to identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to error or fraud, and to design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks and obtain evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentation, or the override of internal control. An audit is not designed to provide assurance on internal control or to identify deficiencies in internal control. Accordingly, we will express no such opinion. However, during the audit, we will communicate to you and those charged with governance internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under professional standards.

We have identified the following significant risks of material misstatement: cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable, other liabilities, revenue recognition, reserve expenditures, debt and special assessments. These are significant risks within the CIRA (Common Interest Realty Associations) industry. As part of our audit planning, we will evaluate significant risks of material misstatements and modifications can be made to address other significant risks as needed.

We will also conclude, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Association's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts and direct confirmation of certain assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected owners, customers, creditors, and financial institutions. Our procedures will not determine whether the funds designated for future major repairs and replacements are adequate to meet such future costs because such a determination is outside the scope of the engagement. We may also request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement.

We may, from time to time and depending on the circumstances, use third-party service providers in serving your account. We may share confidential information about you with these service providers but remain committed to maintaining the confidentiality and security of your information. Accordingly, we maintain internal policies, procedures, and safeguards to protect the confidentiality of your personal information. In addition, we will secure confidentiality agreements with all service providers to maintain the confidentiality of your information and we will take reasonable precautions to determine that they have appropriate procedures in place to prevent the unauthorized release of your confidential information to others. In the event that we are unable to secure an appropriate confidentiality agreement, you will be asked to provide your consent prior to the sharing of your confidential information with the third-party service provider. Furthermore, we will remain responsible for the work provided by any such third-party service providers.

Other Services

We will prepare the Association's federal and state income tax returns for the year ended December 31, 2025 for all relevant federal and state taxing authorities based on information provided by you. We will also assist in preparing the financial statements of Oak Forest Villas Condominium Association, Inc. in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America based on information provided by you.

We will perform the services in accordance with applicable professional standards, including the Statements on Standards for Tax Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The other services are limited to the financial statement and tax services previously defined. We, in our sole professional judgment, reserve the right to refuse to perform any procedure or take any action that could be construed as assuming management responsibilities. We will advise management with regard to tax positions taken in the preparation of the tax return, but management must make all decisions with regard to those matters.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Our audit will be conducted on the basis that you acknowledge and understand your responsibility for designing, implementing, and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, including monitoring ongoing activities; for the selection and application of accounting principles; and for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. You are also responsible for making drafts of financial statements, all financial records, and related information available to us and for the accuracy and completeness of that information (including information from outside of the general and subsidiary ledgers). You are also responsible for providing us with (1) access to all information of which you are aware that is relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements, such as records, documentation, identification of all related parties and all related-party relationships and transactions, and other matters; (2) additional information that we may request for the purpose of the audit; and (3) unrestricted access to persons within the Association from whom we determine it necessary to obtain audit evidence. At the conclusion of our audit, we will require certain written representations from you about the financial statements and related matters.

Your responsibilities include adjusting the financial statements to correct material misstatements and confirming to us in the management representation letter that the effects of any uncorrected misstatements aggregated by us during the current engagement and pertaining to the latest

period presented are immaterial, both individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole.

You are responsible for the design and implementation of programs and controls to prevent and detect fraud, and for informing us about all known or suspected fraud affecting the Association involving (1) management, (2) employees who have significant roles in internal control, and (3) others where the fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements. Your responsibilities include informing us of your knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the Association received in communications from employees, former employees, regulators, or others. In addition, you are responsible for identifying and ensuring that the Association complies with applicable laws and regulations. You are responsible for the preparation of the required supplementary information about future major repairs and replacements. You are responsible for the preparation of the supplementary information in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. You agree to include our report on the supplementary information in any document that contains, and indicates that we have reported on, the supplementary information. You also agree to include the audited financial statements with any presentation of the supplementary information that includes our report thereon.

You agree to assume all management responsibilities for the tax services, financial statement preparation services, and any other nonattest services we provide; oversee the services by designating an individual, preferably from senior management, with suitable skill, knowledge, or experience; evaluate the adequacy and results of the services; and accept responsibility for them.

Engagement Administration, Fees, and Other

We understand that your employees or third-party management company will prepare all cash, receivables, and other confirmations we request and will locate any documents selected by us for testing.

Paul Miller is the engagement partner and is responsible for supervising the engagement and signing the report or authorizing another individual to sign it.

We estimate that our fees for the audit will be \$6,405 and \$295 for the preparation of the tax return form 1120-H. You will also be billed for travel and other out-of-pocket costs such as report production, word processing, postage, etc. The fee estimate is based on anticipated cooperation from your personnel and the assumption that unexpected circumstances will not be encountered during the engagement. Such circumstances include, but are not limited to, insurance claims, lawsuits, floods, fires, hurricanes, special assessments and/or changes in management companies. If significant additional time is necessary, we will keep you informed of any problems we encounter and our fees will be adjusted accordingly. A retainer equal to 50% of the audit fee is required upon execution of this engagement letter. The remaining balance will be due upon issuance of the draft financial statements.

No procedures will begin until the initial retainer has been received. Timely payment of the remaining balance is required for the release of the final financial statements and completion of the engagement. In accordance with our firm policies, work may be suspended if your account becomes 30 days or more overdue and will not resume until the account is paid in full. If we elect to terminate our services due to nonpayment, the engagement will be deemed to have been completed—even if we have not issued our report. You will remain responsible for payment

of all time expended and for reimbursement of any out-of-pocket costs incurred through the date of termination.

Because the vast majority of Associations have December 31 year ends, a very large volume of financial services are required by them during the period January through May. This, of course, creates staffing problems for CPAs whose practice includes CIRA engagements. We will work diligently to meet your needs by scheduling our work based on the dates we receive the signed engagement letters. We will notify you if your engagement may be completed later rather than sooner.

Reporting

We will issue a written report upon completion of our audit of Oak Forest Villas Condominium Association, Inc.'s financial statements. Our report will be addressed to the Board of Directors. Circumstances may arise in which our report may differ from its expected form and content based on the results of our audit. Depending on the nature of these circumstances, it may be necessary for us to modify our opinion or add an emphasis-of-matter paragraph, other-matter paragraph, or separate section to our auditor's report, or if necessary, withdraw from this engagement. If our opinion is other than unmodified, we will discuss the reasons with you in advance. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete the audit or are unable to form or have not formed an opinion, we may decline to express an opinion or withdraw from this engagement.

We appreciate the opportunity to be of service to you and believe this letter accurately summarizes the significant terms of our engagement. If you have any questions, please let us know.
